Before conducting any maintenance procedures, make sure you are wearing proper safety equipment and the machine is disconnected from power.

WEEKLY RECOMMENDED MAINTENANCE

 Inspect the wheels and blade holder for damage Make sure the power cord on the operator's handle is in good working condition and free of damage
Plug the unit in and ensure the on/off switch is functioning properly.
When the unit is powered on, squeeze the control lever forward and the 5280 will move in a forward direction. Adjust the speed using the dial on the front of the handle to ensure it's functioning properly.
Make sure the T-Handle wrench that came with the machine is in the holder located directly below the right-hand grip towards the middle of the handle.
 Remove any glue, mastic, and debris from the wheels, debris deflector, front weight, and blade holder plate. Check for misaligned, binding of moving parts, broken parts and any other conditions that may affect operation.
All maintenance, nameplates and safety stickers must be in place and legible.
Check that the power cord is free of damage.
Check that all screws are tight and secure.
BI-ANNUALLY RECOMMENDED MAINTENANCE
Inspect handle grips for wear and replace if necessary.
Check two allen bolts that secure blade holder cover
for wear and replace periodically.
Check the blade holder for signs of wear, cracks, or other damage. Replace if necessary.
Check rear wheels for damage and excessive wear.
Inspect/replace cutting head bearing.**
Inspect/replace the isolators.**
Remove and replace 15 gallons of Texaco Rando 46

Remove and replace 1.5 gallons of Texaco Rando 46 Hydraulic Oil.
